1st Reading Jeremiah 28:5-9 (New Living Translation - NLT)

⁵Jeremiah responded to Hananiah as they stood in front of all the priests and people at the Temple. ⁶He said, "Amen! May your prophecies come true! I hope the Lord does everything you say. I hope he does bring back from Babylon the treasures of this Temple and all the captives. ⁷But listen now to the solemn words I speak to you in the presence of all these people. ⁸The ancient prophets who preceded you and me spoke against many nations, always warning of war, disaster, and disease. ⁹So a prophet who predicts peace must show he is right. Sermon <u>Christian Hope</u>

Hello – well Ann and I send you greetings, to everyone, from the top of Leamington. Our flat overlooks Christchurch Gardens at the top of the

parade. We have just been able to go and have a picnic (at last) to our favourite escape spot (our caravan) just outside Stratford and we are hopeful that we will be able to spend more time there soon.

Our bible passage this morning, from Jeremiah I hope will give us some helpful insights into Christian Hope. The one from Matthew, some pointers to "living today".

First a story....

Ann and I lived in Birmingham when we first got married. We bought a house in the road that I had been born in. Every workday, I walked about 1/4 mile to the bus stop in order to catch the bus into Birmingham City centre to work. At the top of the road we lived in I turned left and passed several houses set back from the road. In the middle of a row of houses there lived an elderly, large woman. Very of often in the mornings I would see her going up and down the garden paths of the houses in the row. I realised as time went by that she was "knocking up" the occupants of the houses to ensure they got up for work. She was always still in her dressing gown and slippers, irrespective of the weather, and invariably would greet me with her usual greeting which was "terrible in't it"! It didn't matter whether it was sunny, raining, early or late. The greeting was always the same. Ann and I called her "old Mrs Shuffle Slippers". When we had our first child and pushed her out in a pram, old Mrs Shuffle Slippers greeted us with "Ooo, didn't know you got a "Bab" – terrible is it" Ann and I had to laugh.

As time went by, I realised that in fact old Mrs Shuffle Slippers was trying to empathise and give herself in the way she knew how.

Now some people a really naturally optimistic and some people are natural pessimists. Which on are you? The minister of the first church that Ann and I were part of used to say of me that I

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was like a rubber ball. If I got hit with a hammer I would just "bounce". Being naturally optimistic can be helpful but can also be a hindrance. If God wants to speak to a natural optimist then gentle pressure is often the way he does it, to reshape.

The Bible story in Jeremiah chapter 28 tells of Hananiah's prophecy to the people – a positive one. Telling the people that everything would be restored from captivity back to Jerusalem. Everything will be alright soon. In fact you have read on to the end of chapter 28 to find out that Hananiah wasn't actually bringing the word of God, but his own optimistic view! God speaks to Jeremiah a very different word and he has the job of delivering it to Hananiah.

He also writes to those in exile in Babylon (in chapter 29) from Jerusalem and tells them to "seek peace and prosperity in the land to which God has carried them" and "pray for the land where they are" and "not to just listen to natural optimists".

So, I hear you ask – where's your hope and good news for now! Not just the empathy of "old Mrs SS" but real hope.

Hope, Christian Hope, is knowing as Ephesians 4 v 6 says that "God is over all, through all and in all"

Tom Wright has written many wonderful books, I think the only one that I have read cover to cover, is called "Surprised by Hope". It gives real foundation to the work God does in our hearts, creating solid hope for both now and eternity in the work that we do now.

To Wright writes:

"What you do in the present—by painting, preaching, singing, sewing, praying, teaching, building hospitals, digging wells, campaigning for justice, writing poems, caring for the needy, loving your neighbour as yourself—will last into God's future. These activities are not simply ways of making the present life a little less beastly, a

little more bearable, until the day when we leave it behind altogether. They are part of what we may call building for God's kingdom."

Tom Wright – Surprised by Hope.

So, turning to Matthew's Gospel – what guidance does he give us to living in our current times:

In the verses I have taken 3 "keep on's" to keep us going and have our "firm foundations" in "Christian Hope"

Keep on – Listening – hear the words of those speaking God's word to you. Try or test what they say and if it resonates hold it closely in your heart. Keep listening closely to what God is saying to you. Don't just listen to natural optimism or pessimism. If you listen to God's voice you will become God's messenger.

Keep on Receiving – receiving is sometimes as hard as it is to give. The message Bible says" accepting someone's help is as good as giving someone help". If you are able to receive help you will also know how to give it.

Keep on Giving – begin in small ways, "like the cup of water". We learn from small steps and nothing is wasted in God's economy.

Overall – remember that just as the whole of the book of Revelation teaches us "God is "over all".

Finish with a quote from Tom Wright's Surprised by Hope:

"people who believe in the resurrection, in God making a whole new world in which everything will be set right at last, are unstoppably motivated to work for that new world in the present."
