Results of Justification

The Promise of the Holy Spirit

Sermon

Greetings to you all, whether you have been a follower of Jesus for decades or have just come to see him as Lord. This afternoon it will be dark by 6.00pm so winter looms, and the Covid 19 news does not uplift us. The tasks of a preacher are to encourage, to build up, to comfort and to challenge, so today I choose encouragement. When on the local preachers training course, I was told 'always isolate the dominant thought' so the dominant thought for today is using faith in Christ to face the problems and troubles of everyday life.

Before I set off, allow me to touch on a paradox in Scripture in relation to suffering. We are told that suffering is used to refine us, as you heard in Psalm 69 David links his troubles to his guilt and yet we also hear that God is always there for us - our reading from Isaiah ended "but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar on wings like eagles.". To our New Testament readings, in Romans Paul states "suffering produces perseverance" raising the issue of God's discipline, yet John tells us "I will not leave you as orphans, I will come to you." Let us hold the two elements – suffering as discipline, and love of God empowering us, in a positive tension.

So now to the dominant thought. - overcoming daily difficulties.

As believers in Jesus we look to him to be our example. As individuals we all have memorable highs and lows and so did Jesus – the Mount of Transfiguration is set in stark contrast to the garden of Gethsemane. For Jesus most of life was not lived at these extremes and it is the same for us. To face daily difficulties effectively it is important for us to choose right thoughts and that is why we are told to have the mind of Christ because where the mind goes, the person follows. Did Jesus encounter daily difficulties? Yes! – let us take a quick look at some.

I'll start with people pressure. Mark's gospel tells us that Jesus had got up early to pray in solitude, but his companions went to find him to tell him "Everyone is looking for you". In Luke Jesus' mother and brothers came to seek him but they could not get near him on account of the crowds. Where are you most at ease? Perhaps listening to music or in your garden. For me it is alone on the mountains of Cumbria and Scotland so pressure from people is not a strength for me at all.

Another trial for Jesus was opposition, especially from religious people. In Mark's gospel the

Pharisees accuse Jesus of eating with sinners and the chief priests ask him “by what authority are you doing these things?” Notice how Jesus did not stand on his status by replying 'Don't you know who I am?' Instead he gives them questions to throw them into confusion. It is very testing to meet ingratitude and opposition when you are trying to do good, but we should expect it. As believers in Jesus we cannot expect a quiet life as we are told to be salt and light. Salt stings as it heals whilst light reveals things that people want to keep hidden.

A third trial of Jesus was from his disciples – James & John ask him for the top spot and in frustration he replies “you do not know what you are asking, can you drink the cup I drink?” Peter says to Jesus “explain the parable” to which Jesus answers “Why are you still so dull? If we could hear the tone of voice used in these two replies by Jesus, we would probably pick up a tone of deep exasperation. Is it possible that a Methodist minister ever felt frustration with his or her congregations? Of course not.

Some daily difficulties we share with Jesus and others we do not, BUT as followers of Jesus we need to know what he had to help him carry on? I have chosen three truths that, as believers, we share with him. Now taking hold of them is not the same as knowing about them. I preach to myself & I need to keep asking myself “Has it really taken hold? What evidence is there that it has actually dropped?

First truth we share with Jesus is as he was a child of God, we are children of God, Not only children but HIS beloved children. Because Jesus has taken our sin away, the close relationship that Jesus had with his Father is available to us. In Psalm 69 the writer says, “my guilt is not hidden from you”. That is the Old Testament but for us that guilt has been dealt with. If Isaiah can write about faith in God giving strength to the weary and hope that soars like eagles HOW

MUCH MORE does that apply to us since we now have Jesus and the Holy Spirit? In the Highlands I have seen plenty of eagles, to watch them soar is an inspiration. Let us live in that truth as an inspiration. At this point I remind you that you have an enemy in the spiritual realm who does NOT want that truth to drop.

Second truth. As Jesus was empowered by the Holy Spirit following his baptism, so are we once we confess our sins and believe in Jesus. In Romans Chapter 5 Paul tells us “hope does not disappoint us because God has poured out his love into our lives by the Holy Spirit who is in us and never leaves us.” For anyone not sure who is the Holy Spirit, the Bible is a story of the one creator God who comes close to a special people, those of Israel, He then comes closer **to all people** in the person of Jesus. In Jesus God is walking his patch to be with us. Next to those who repent and believe, God comes even closer to live actually within us. **How I need to let that truth drop and stay in my heart**. If we can claim to be Christians, folk have a right to say, “Then show me the evidence.” Our actions are vital but also our words. Let us ask ourselves “What sort of world will our words create today?” We can diminish the power of the Holy Spirit by either quenching or grieving that person. This is why in the beatitudes Jesus tells us “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.” Our hearts are not pure when we have sinful thoughts which can stick to us like flies stick to fly paper so we MUST deal with them.

Thirdly. Jesus needed others and so do we. God's model for restoring this world is in Jesus. God did not just 'snap his fingers and say 'done'” did he? He sent Jesus who got help from others. When we are strong, we can definitely do stuff, when we are on the back foot, we need help. We all have times when we are strong and can give to others, and other times when we are broken.

Now good fortune (in this world) is not shared equally, but for **many, tragedy suddenly becomes a reality in our lives.** The inevitable happens, you lose your job, you get sick, you have an accident, a loved one dies. Perhaps one of the hardest things is when a long term illness hits us and continues for decades. When **we do need** help, we must not be too proud to ask for help, or so eager to get others to help that we fail to take action to help ourselves.

There is a balance here. Let us go back to Psalm 69 where David writes “If only one person would turn and comfort me” One truth that Jesus found when needing help from others was that they would let him down – and that will happen to us – **just as we fail others, so they will fail us.** BUT, and this is something else we need to learn, Jesus did not let these failings destroy him and so we must try to follow Him in that way.

Let us affirm our faith by believing that we are children of God, filled by the Holy Spirit, with friends to help us, because these truths will transform the quality of our lives. Let us see correct thoughts as a candle flame shedding light into gloom and despair. Knowing Jesus gives light to our inner being. With right thoughts in place inside us we can deal with the things that happen outside us, our circumstances. It is crucial for us to choose right thoughts. Where the mind goes, the person follows. May we seek to hold on to the best of our personalities, with the gifts we have been given, and have the rest modified into the mould of Christ. Amen.
