Gospel John 15:1-17 (NRSVA)

Jesus the True Vine

¹'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself

unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. ⁹As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. ¹⁰If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

¹²'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Sermon

One of the areas I have total incompetency in is gardening. Occasionally I have a friend who buys me a plant for an occasion such as my birthday, or Samuel will bring home a sunflower that we are meant to grow at home. So far, not one of them has survived. With the exception that we have become experts at growing dandelions in all the wrong places, which provides delicious food for our guinea pigs. So, I'm not convinced that I'm the best person to bring this metaphor to life.

Therefore, I'm starting at the end of the passage instead of the beginning and I'll I use the illustration of small humans, that has at times been the all-consuming part of my life for the last 7ish years.

'Remain in my love.'

After the 3 trimesters of pregnancy, the baby is born and you enter the 4th trimester in which a new born has no sense of themselves as an individual. They identify themselves completely as their primary care giver. The two of them are one. They have no awareness that that the tiny hands and feet waving before them are their own. Or that their mothers eyes are not their own.

Phycologists explain that as an infant begins their understanding of self-awareness, they still understand themselves in the mirror of their parents' eyes, especially their mothers. What her eyes tell us about ourselves, we believe and become. It's a mirror game.

Prayer is much the same. As we receive and return the divine gaze.

In the first two or three years, we know ourselves in the security of those who hold us and gaze upon us. Its' not heard, or seen. It's felt. That's original knowing.

In my mothers' eyes I am beloved and secure.

And yet separation happens, and I start to see myself through the eyes that compare, compete, judge and dismiss. The division has to happen. We can't stay there forever, letting our mother gaze at us.

Being rooted, grounded and nurtured in love.

Remain in my love.

The first part of this passage about vine and branches has always felt judgemental to me. Cutting out the sin and the places that I am not worthy. But have I understood it correctly?

After all I want to grow personally and produce fruit. And to produce the best fruit I need pruning. Am I in the place that I will allow myself to be pruned?

How can we surrender unless we believe there is someone trustworthy out there to surrender to?

How can we be pruned and therefore grow, unless we start with an awareness of the presence of God and an understanding that we are loved.

Prayer and presence become that mirrored place. As we receive and return the divine gaze of a God who loves us and has good plans for us.

Becoming aware of the presence of God. As St Patrick said: God beneath you, God in front of you, God behind you, God above you, God within you.

You cannot earn this. You cannot prove yourself worth of God. Feeling God's presence is simply a matter of awareness.

And there are these beautiful simple moments that we have, when we capture something of the love of God. Maybe in awe and wonder at the universe around us. Christians and non-Christians have experienced it. As they behold and gaze at something new. 'Lost in wonder, love and praise.' I was listening to a podcast the other day and it said 'Pay attention to the things that fascinate you. Why are you drawn to it? What is it trying to say to me?'

For if you can love, then you have known something of the presence of God.

What if I don't always feel the presence of God? None of us are completely and fully present and aware of the presence of God. So don't feel guilty. We have moments where we have been aware of the presence of God and from that we are rooted.

Do we allow ourselves to grow?

Our Gospel is essentially about life, death and resurrection. To live, grow and transformation there needs to be life, death and resurrection. And the pruning moments can feel uncomfortable. But there has to be death for resurrection to occur. In the prologue of Richard Rohr's book 'Everything Belongs', he asks:

'How do you talk about dying to a church that tries to appear perfect'? 'How do we talk about descent, when everything is about ascent?' 'How do we talk about letting- go in a capitalist culture?'

How do you make the talk about pruning attractive when it isn't? How can we allow ourselves to be in a place of growth?

Jesus spoke to his disciples, calling them to take up their cross and follow him. They had to submit to the pruners knife, cutting away other goals and ambitions.

They have already borne fruit; they must now expect more pruning, so that they can bear more fruit.

'You didn't choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.'

From all of this comes humility of knowing who's in charge. Surrender.

It's a personal relationship of Love. To the one who loves us more than we know can begin to understand. The one who will tenderly love us and hold us through our growing pains, falls and mistakes. The one who prunes back that we might flourish.

How will we remain in God's love? Through Him we will live, grow and bear much fruit. Amen
