While I'm one of the ministers stationed in the circuit, I don't have pastoral charge of any churches. That's because my role is as Free Church Chaplain at the University of Warwick, where I serve alongside other chaplains from different Christian and Faith traditions. In common with most walks of life, the last year or so has been a strange time to be a University Chaplain. We're blessed at Warwick to have a good chaplaincy building at the heart of campus, with room for worship and prayer, study, socialising, making food and drink, conversations private and shared and more besides. Our motto of Faith, Food and Friendship gives a clear picture of the kind of community that we aspire to be, across staff and students and our many faith traditions. But of course Covid restrictions swept much of this away and we were left, as many were, wondering how to sustain our life as a community when our normal patterns were no longer possible. More than a year on, we've learned a great deal and creating community is still one of our key aims in ministering at the heart of the University.

On this Trinity Sunday, we reflect again on the nature of God as Trinity, a community of persons if you like. One way of looking at this is to say that because God exists eternally as three persons, bound together in perfect love, God gives us a vision of community. God doesn't just call us to relationship; God is relationship. The miracle of grace is that that relationship is not closed but open: God calls each of us to share in that love that is at God's heart. In our discipleship, in our communities, in our churches, we are called to embody that love and to share it. The ways we can do that can and will change but we can be assured that God's ever-loving nature will never change. God was love in the beginning, is now and shall be for ever.

Teach us, O God, to know you as three persons yet one God, to rejoice in your love and to show it in our lives, through Christ our Lord.
