Jesus asked "Who are my mother and my brothers? I write at the end of a day spent with my sister, her husband, my broth and his wife and my own wife. It's the first actual get together in many months though we have 'zoomed' coffee and cake a couple of times! For many years my mother had been the link ensuring all the family down the generations were kept in contact. Our lads referred to her home in Banbury as GCHQ as she seemed to have all the intelligence on us. We marveled how it was that in 1985 she phoned me from Banbury early one morning when I and my family was living in Gweru (Zimbabwe) to check that we were OK. She had just heard on the BBC World service that there had been a riot in Gweru late the previous evening. "News to me" I said. No idea what you are talking about. In fact there has been an uprising in the relatively nearby town ship (about 2 miles).

Two things stand out from that incident. Firstly how much many parts of the world depend on the BBC for unbiased news of events in their country where the local media is censored. Secondly the extent of a mother's life long concern for her children.

The inquiry into the Bashir interview of Princess Diana has damaged that reputation a little, probably more in the UK than abroad. A reminder that whatever organization we belong to, including the church, our errors of judgement have ripples far away from the actual lapse itself. We all have a responsibility to stand together and hold differences of opinion together as a loving family does at its best. And I wonder how Jesus' question when Mary came to hear of it must have hurt. I understand what he was driving at – in the work of the kingdom there will be times when the needs of others are more important than even our own family but she may have found that hard to bear then day. It is balanced by his care for her even as he was dying entrusting her care to "the disciple whom he loved"

There is though an underlying truth as well. And that family is more then those who share a bunch of genes. The adopted child, children from a partner's prior marriage, and many other groups form into families as deep and worthy, sometimes functioning better then our birth family. I ma grateful for the work done and continuing to be done keeping this Christian family – the South Warwickshire Circuit of Methodist Churches, you and me in touch with each other and able to hold one another before God in prayer.
