Dear Friends,

Greetings and Happy New year to you all. I hope you have had the best Christmas celebration possible in these pandemic influenced times. You will realise that I am writing this letter before Christmas so can take nothing for granted. The Omicron variant is spreading fast at the moment and folks are rushing to get their booster vaccinations. Though not all who are eligible will go because, for reasons beyond my understanding, some people would rather risk an unpleasant, even fatal illness than have inoculations. So, my hope is that you are warm and safe reading this in your home looking back on a pleasant time of celebration on your own or with others. COVID has forced some changes on us all some of which are actually a good thing. For example in 2020 my wife and I found the cards we had given each other for birthdays and Christmases because card shops were closed at the time we needed to buy birthday cards. Rather than buy new ones this December we are exchanging the same again and giving a bit extra to a homeless charity. Maybe Christmas 2022 we will buy carefully chosen cards and use them for a couple of years.

As I was saying earlier, it's difficult to write a new year letter some two weeks in advance when things are so unpredictable. The same was true of the first Christmas. Mary knew she would have a baby which was uniquely conceived but she had no idea where, or in what circumstance Jesus would be born. Joseph must have been beside himself finding no one willing to give in house hospitality when the birth was so imminent and, apparently, there were no women around willing to act as midwife. Then there were the unexpected visitors at the stable. Just when things might have been improving Joseph (according to one of the suggested readings for today) has a nocturnal visitor in a dream who instructs him to take Mary and Jesus and seek refuge in Egypt. Throughout history it seems violence has driven so many people to embark on perilous journeys seeking a safe place of welcome, warmth and a chance to be self-supporting in a peaceful place. His motivation is the same that drives thousands of people, sometimes across continents, in our generation to seek refuge or asylum. Tragically many of those fleeing human violence or the violence of extreme weather (floods and droughts symptomatic of climate change) are exploited by human traffickers.

What are your hopes for this new year? I'm sure that you will share my hope that the current COVID variant will not be as devastating as some fear and that any further new variants will not evade vaccine triggered antibodies. I pray also that better and humane ways of dealing with the desperate refugees who are deceived into boarding flimsy dinghies to cross the English Channel will be found by international cooperation. My hope is that as churches and individuals we can adapt to and change with the way all our lives have been disrupted by forces seen and unseen in these unpredictable days. In all this I hope we still believe "The best of all, God is with us" (John Wesley)
