Hello everyone, and warmest New Year Greetings to you all,

This letter comes to you in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Churches Together in Warwick describes this as 'an opportunity for Christians around the world to focus their prayers on the Church as the body of Christ, to celebrate its many diverse yet uniquely important parts, and to pray for closer relationships with each other and a shared vision of God's work that we are called to do'. Globally, nationally, denominationally and within our own local areas and churches, this feels more important than ever. The climate crisis cannot be addressed unless the world works together. The unequal response to the coronavirus pandemic across the globe has highlighted and confirmed the injustice that exists for poorer nations. Our government speaks of a 'levelling up' agenda, at a time when perhaps we feel less of a 'United Kingdom' than ever. So it feels to me that our prayers for unity in all sorts of spheres are needed now more than ever.

The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2022 is 'We saw his star in the East...' and recalls the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child in Bethlehem. As the 2022 resource reminds us, the visitors came from afar, traditionally from different areas and backgrounds, but were united by their common purpose in desiring to come close to the Son of God.

So it feels particularly poignant that the text for this year's resource should have been chosen by the churches of the Middle East, where to maintain a hope for unity must be such a struggle, and to be able to pray for unity must be a sign of deep and loving faith. At Queen's, a group of us were due to visit the Holy Land, but this was sadly cancelled due to the pandemic. Just a few weeks after the date of our proposed trip, I read of rockets being launched and retaliatory fire. And in the summer last year, tensions erupted again. Our news is full of stories about the enduring hardships of the Palestinians, and on Thursday it will be Holocaust Memorial Day, where we remember the unimaginable suffering of the Jewish people. What a complex and seemingly insurmountable set of problems this area is faced with. Surely only fervent, diligent, spirit-filled prayer can begin to make a difference for these divided lands. I invite you to add your personal prayers for this region this week.

The Psalm that is set for today, Psalm 19, is one featured in Carla Grosch-Miller's wonderful book, *Psalms Redux*. *Redux* means 'brought back' or 'revived'. She writes that these prayers are not meant to supplant the Psalms, but simply to 'refresh and enrich their vocabulary of prayer and worship'. In her poem based on Psalm 19, she writes:

Keep us from arrogance and vanity.
Root our desire in Your goodness
and Your sweet grace.

Praying into a Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, this seems a good place to begin.

I'll sign off with some words from Wesley, which feel particularly relevant to us as a denomination at this time:

Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences.

God bless you. Keep praying, keep smiling, keep testing!
