"He tends His flock like a shepherd,: He gathers the lambs in His arms and carries them close to His heart; He gently leads those that have young." Isaiah 40: 11. What a lovely image of our God and how appropriate for this April edition when we see young lambs in the fields and for a pastoral letter. (Pastor means Shepherd). Its one of a series of metaphors in this chapter of Isaiah's prophesies and introduces the third and final part of this amazing book. These words of hope and comfort were addressed to a nation who have been driven out of their towns and cities by a powerful invading and occupying army. Almost entire populations moved from their homes fleeing for their lives and/or being taken to settle in the empire of the oppressor. A situation that rings with rather more relevance today than we would like. Already European Union countries have received and accommodated seven figure numbers of people displaced from towns and cities of Ukraine and by the time you read this a few thousand will have settled into homes and hostels in this country too. The generous response of UK individuals, villages, towns and cities has been very moving and stirs a sense of common humanity. Hosts will receive an unexpected but welcome contribution from tax payers towards their costs.

The metaphor of shepherd which is frequently used throughout the Bible and Jesus appropriates to himself as" The Good Shepherd" (John 10:11) is one I am reminded of every week at Stratford Livestock Market. My earliest memories include seeing new born lambs that are underweight or orphaned or for some reason have been placed in a box of straw close to the range in the kitchen or living room for warmth and a watchful eye. I see my late father in his khaki smock carrying twins in his arms leading their mother to a safe spot after their birth as farmers did and do for thousands of years. As you watch the idyllic scene of lambs playing in the fields returning to their mums for a top up of milk every little while spare a thought and prayer for the farmer who has and will tend them. She/he will have worked literally night and day for six weeks with little sleep during lambing. Spare a thought and prayer too for refugees from Ukraine who are settling into homes up and down this country and for their hosts who have taken them in at considerable personal costs and inconvenience. Then spare a thought and a prayer for those who have fled other conflicts who are not allowed access to this country and become prey to those who exploit them in their plight.
