Hooray! It's Palm Sunday, all donkeys, cloaks and cheering! So, is it too early to look forward (if that's the right expression) to Good Friday? After all, this time next week we will be celebrating the resurrection and unless you're planning to take part in a Good Friday service or walk of witness it can seem like simply two joyful celebratory Sundays in a row, like travelling across a bridge between two peaks without ever looking into the chasm below. Just as peaks don't have meaning without troughs, the resurrection doesn't have meaning without the crucifixion.

So what does the cross mean to you? How do you respond to the many different depictions in art of the crucifixion? Do you see a historical figure being cruelly treated by the authorities and abandoned by his closest friends? Do you see God incarnate? To what extent do you see a connection across the centuries with your own life? Do you feel he did something for you that day, without ever knowing of your future existence?

Without the cross the resurrection would be little more than a happy ending. How can we celebrate God's victory over death if we don't see Jesus' sacrifice on the cross as his ultimate and perfect gift to us?

I find Holy Week passes too quickly. So much happens in the gospel accounts we have little time to pause and reflect – the cleansing of the temple, the fig tree, countless teachings and parables, the anointing at Bethany, the Upper Room, Judas, Gethsemane, Pilate, Peter's denials, and that's even before we reach the cross itself. But pause and reflect we must.

Two millennia ago God sent his only Son. For three years he preached, taught and healed. Then he travelled to Jerusalem, the seat of power and was hailed as king. Yet his radical message of love was too strong for the authorities who put him to death like a common thief. They thought, hoped, that would be the end of the matter, that their authority would exceed his, that force and violence would expose his weakness, that their version of the truth would win out, that this would be seen as just a flash in the pan, that in the end he would be remembered as an irrelevance, if remembered at all.

We are Christian, followers of Jesus, because we know different. May the events of Holy Week touch you in a new and fresh way, reveal His love for you, and in a world full of darkness and suffering, give you hope.
