Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid.

Greetings all. As I write we are seeing images and hearing stories of those who went to Spain for a holiday or to visit family who face quarantine on their return. I am sure I am not alone in having mixed feelings about their plight – sympathy for those who wanted to be with family after at least 20 weeks apart some of whom will have been bereaved, empathy for those who have worked through lock down and need a holiday, support for the hospitality providers and airlines hit so hard economically. Somewhat different feelings about those who have been furloughed for months but still wanted to go on their annual binge of sun, sand and sangria without thinking through the possibility of short notice restrictions in these highly unpredictable days. Disbelief as one holiday maker, a hair dresser, said she would have to try and contact her clients to cancel their bookings while she was compulsory self-isolating for a fortnight. I thought she ought to at home trimming lockdown hair growth after weeks of enforced 'leave' from her clients......

But then I don't know her circumstance – just a 30 second clip in the news. Perhaps this holiday was booked long before lockdown and there would have been no refund, or many other good reasons that mean her clients will have to wait a little longer, perhaps another half inch! Its so easy to jump to conclusions and judge others as being less worthy than ourselves. Jesus warns against judging others and has harsh words for hypocrites...

Lockdown news reporting has reminded how complex society is and that issues are never simple. I welcome the Black Lives Matter campaign as it raises real issues of racism and bias some of which is enshrined in institutions. But it too obscures and ignores other injustices. Racism is experienced daily by non-black people on a daily basis. Villagers resent 'new comers', regions dislike and distrust other regions within a country, nations blame 'foreigners' for the problems they face and so on. Issues are never simple matters of good/bad; right/wrong. In this pandemic there are so many losers – bereaved families, job losses, mental health and delayed physical health treatments. But there are a few 'winners'. While most producers and retailers have been hit catastrophically others have made a fortune. The largest baked beans factory, for example, increased production and sales by 50 percent. On-line shopping sites have profited on an unprecedented scale – the two biggest are also most adept at avoiding Corporation, employment and council taxes! As Christians we should be concerned about injustices and pray for those in power to govern with wisdom. In our conversations, perhaps at the hair-dressers(!), we need to bring balance, enhance tolerance and be agents of healing this broken world.

Today's gospel reading focuses on being calm and trusting our Lord even on troubled waters.
