"Do not be afraid" said Gabriel to Mary. (Luke 1:30). Fear of the unknown is a natural reaction not limited to humans! I was laying our roadside paddock hedge the other afternoon when a Dad with his son were walking up the hill soon to pass me. Coming down the hill was a young woman riding one and leading another horse. The sight of my wheel barrow on the verge was enough to spook one of the horses who needed calming to walk past this scary thing. The little boy couldn't understand why the horse found a barrow with tools frightening. I think the answer is that the barrow wasn't there earlier when last the horse passed by which means it must be able to move, and if it can move, what will it do?......

Mary's response of fear is understandable and certainly forgivable. The fear of the unknown, perhaps informed by negative earlier experiences is common to all of us human and equine. Such fear can deter people from joining an act of Christian worship or coming to a fellowship meeting, or prayer meeting or some other faith linked activity. Will I be put on the spot? Will I be judged because I don't know what to do or say? Am I good enough? Will I fit in? These, and so many questions spin in our minds.

What Gabriel told Mary would strike fear into anyone's heart. Finding that you are going to be a parent if you are trying for a baby is one thing but discovering you are pregnant when that was not on your agenda is a whole different experience I imagine. Will I be judged? Will Joseph still want me? How will I feed him? Where will we live? And so many more concerns. But this is also a divine encounter more overwhelming than any of us can imagine. The challenge and responsibility of preparing and leading an act of worship that will enable a congregation to meet with their Lord on a Sunday morning in Warwickshire gives me enough anxiety thanks. But to be the means of having not only her life changed but through her all who will believe in all generations will be changed too. Wow!

Our own short term future is full of unknowns at the moment. As I write we are waiting to hear if a Brexit deal can be struck. Local farmers and businesses have much at stake hanging on the outcome whatever that is. Will COVID Vaccines be available on a scale needed? Will Christmas gatherings lead to another spike in illness and deaths? All the unknowns could paralyse us if we let them but just like Mary we need to trust in Immanuel, God with us, the powerful "known" in a world of unknowns. Celebrate Christmas as best you are able because restrictions in movement and numbers cannot take away the joyful celebration of His birth for Christian believers.
