There are many things of note and significance from conference this year, mainly talk around the vote to allow same sex couples to marry in our churches. Another first is our new President of the <u>Methodist</u> Conference is the Revd Sonia Hicks. She became the first black woman to hold the post when she was inducted during Conference at the National Conference Centre in Birmingham on Saturday June 26<sup>th</sup>. I wanted to take note of her address in our pastoral letter this week.

In her address to the Conference, which was held in hybrid form this year (both in person and online), she reflected on the <u>racism</u> and marginalisation that she and her family had experienced, and how the Church could respond to injustice and division in society today.

Rev Sonia recalled the experience of her Great Aunt Lizzie, who had arrived from Jamaica with her Methodist membership card only to be rejected from her local church because she was black. She and her family eventually found a home at Walworth Methodist Church in south London.

"In a world where people are excluded because of their ethnic background, their sexual orientation, their gender, or simply because, like me, they were brought up on a council estate, I believe that we are called to show God's love for all people,"

"It is a calling that Christian people have always struggled with, but we can and should be better at making God's love a reality in the British Methodist Church, overcoming the systemic discrimination that exists."

"As Christians we are to mirror the grace and the mercy of God. We are to find ways of issuing God's invitation of acceptance to those we meet on a daily basis. No ifs, no buts. I believe that there is a place for all in the presence of God, at God's table.

"But, as we acknowledge that everyone has a place, we also must acknowledge that we will therefore live with the tension of not all thinking the same. We will also have to recognise that living with such tension is never the easy option."

It was 4 days later that the Methodist Church heard and accepted the 'God Love Unites Us' report to conference. Many are celebrating whilst others are in deep pain. As we learn to welcome the 'other', and live together with contradictory convictions, may we learn to mirror God's grace and mercy, accepting all we meet on our way.
