Greetings all. One of my sons is in the Royal Navy, a submariner to be precise. Not a job I could do for a whole number of reasons – his degree is in physics so he understands the nuclear reactor that powers the vessel, he is a confident swimmer so passes the underwater emergency escape tests, and he is able to adjust to living in a confined space for months. I feel claustrophobic in minutes if I am in a restricted space. He called in with his wife and daughters enroute to a sailing competition, this time on the surface in the Solent! He recently returned from a submerged tour lasting nearly half a year looking as pale as you would expect having not seen natural light throughout that time. We were discussing what he missed most and longed for while away (apart from the obvious friends and family time).

High on his "longed for" list was home cooked food. The crew survived many weeks of rations, rehydrated food, frozen meat and veg, and a limited menu to say the least. When I say 'home cooked' please understand that apart from familiar meals when visiting family, when at home he does most of the cooking. For him its therapeutic and part of how he and his wife share household responsibilities. After months of eating what was prepared by a chef, at last he can be involved in preparing and sharing the meal with those most loved. Longing for the familiar, or 'normality', tension in relationships – complaints and misunderstandings feature in today's Psalm and gospel passage. As we slowly emerge from our national social restrictions and are able to do some things previously outlawed, we still have longings and yearnings I'm sure. Most of us are now coming for worship as a congregation, albeit with thought and actions to keep ourselves and others safe, but not everyone feels able to return to such gatherings of people while others are not sufficiently mobile to do so.

"Eating the flesh and drinking the blood" of Jesus was unsurprisingly misunderstood by those who had been part of the feeding miracle as our Lord tried to get folks to think beyond the immediate and physical. He wanted them to reach for the mystical and eternal things that can only be expressed in metaphor and symbol. This year's Methodist Conference seems to have understood how folks have felt cut off from the sacrament of Holy Communion for many months and now permits participation at home with an on line service. But what of those who do not have access to the internet? If you are waiting patiently for the chance to enter that mystical experience again, the bread and the wine, the sense of belonging to the body, then let your pastoral visitor or church contact person know so that she/he can make arrangements for home or extended communion for you. Waiting and longing are a common experience for many people but we are doing all we can to shorten that time of yearning....
